# Miami-Dade 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan STEERING COMMITTEE #5 Meeting Summary

Friday, July 6, 2018

A Miami-Dade 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan Steering Committee Meeting was held July 6, 2018 via WebEx. A list of attendees is attached to this Meeting Summary.

#### 1. Introductions:

Carlos Roa, TPO LRTP Project Manager, opened the meeting and welcomed everyone to the meeting. Members present were identified by agency.

## 2. Miami-Dade Freight Plan

Jeff Weidner, Marlin, presented the 2018 Miami-Dade County Freight developed for the TPO. This Freight Plan updated the 2014 Miami-Dade Freight Plan. The presentation included background information on the existing conditions for freight including networks, trucking, rail, port, and warehousing; freight issues – security and truck parking, performance measures –Truck Travel Time Reliability (TTTTR), requirements and targets; multimodal project needs – a list of project needs by mode for airport, seaport, and rail; and Freight Logistics Zone applications.

#### 3. The Underline

Irene Hegedus, Miami-Dade Transportation & Public Works, presented on the Underline, a 10 mile neighborhood park, urban trail, and living art destination. The benefits of the Underline were highlighted including improved bike-ped safety, connectivity, return on investment – increasing property values and jobs, multimodal corridor – bringing all modes together, a transportation solution – encouraging the use of other modes, sustainable growth, and public and community health. The phasing and project costs were also outlined with graphics to illustrate the project.

### 4. Future Technologies & Autonomous Vehicles

Tewari Edmonson and Lisa Colmenares, from the Miami-Dade TPO, presented the TPO Future Technologies & Autonomous Vehicles Study. The impact of Future technology to the 2045 LRTP was presented.

# 5. Transportation Performance Management Update

David Henderson, Miami-Dade TPO, presented updates on Performance Management including FDOT's pavement, bridge, and system performance targets, FDOT/MPOAC Collaborative Process Consensus Document Approval, PM Compliance of the 2040 LRTP and 2018 TIP, and on DTPW's Transit Asset Management Plan.
